Art: Drawing Fundamentals	Learning how to use the 7 basic art elements to add dimension and shape to your line drawings is the key ingredient that will bring your drawings to life. This class will show you how to use simple lines in different combinations to make beautiful, dimensional artwork. Focusing on several different styles – abstract, geometric, representational, and organic – We will use tools to help you define shape, including positive and negative space exercises, and lessons on how to use shading to add definition. Whether you are using pencils or pens, this class will take your line drawing to the next level.
