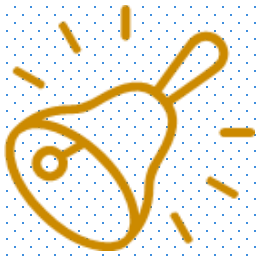
**House President and Vice President:** Senior students who provide leadership to House Leaders

**House Exec Team:** Students who assist the President and Vice President in providing leadership to their assigned House  
**Teacher Advisors**

The House system provides opportunities for what we call “vertical unity.” Rather than the standard categories of grade and age providing an identity, the House encourages younger students to look up to and interact with older students, while the older students are given the opportunity to lead and care for the younger students. All 6<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade students and teachers are assigned to a House. Through the years, students from the same family are assigned to the same House to build and nurture the legacy of community interactions.

House Activities are scheduled for one Friday each month and are led by the House Leaders and House Assistants

- Intramurals: athletic and non-athletic activities(sports, strategy games-ex. Chess, drama/singing, community food events/cookoffs)
- Pep Rallies
- Knights’ Fest

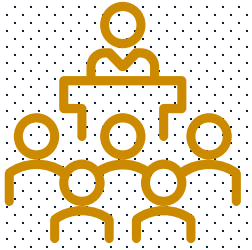


# COMMUNICATIONS

The Communications Director (Senior) and Assistant Director (Senior or Junior) will work with all student Leadership Groups and organizations, with oversight from the Director of Communications, to manage student communications for the Knightly News, the Commons Area message board, and social media posts.



# CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

*Serve as liaisons between the student community and the CCS Administration*

**Class Representatives** will be referred by students and appointed by teachers and the CCS Administration. Each 7<sup>th</sup> grade – 12<sup>th</sup> grade class will have representation.

The Class Representatives and School Administrators will engage in rational, loving conversations addressing issues concerning our classrooms, our culture, and our campus.



# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

*Provide leadership for social, service, and worship activities at school and in the local communities*



The **Social President** (Senior), the **Social Vice President** (Senior or Junior), and **Social Exec Team** are responsible for leading, planning and implementing social events at CCS. The Social Events currently include Hoedown, Snowball, and multiple special days.

The **Service President** (Senior), the **Service Vice President** (Senior or Junior) and **Service Exec Team** are responsible for leading, planning, and implementing service opportunities at CCS. The President and Vice President chair the lunch program. CCS Service will offer one service project per quarter. Examples may include interactions between Lower School and Upper School students, Angel Tree, and Food Drives.

The **Worship President** (Senior), the **Worship Vice President** (Senior or Junior), and **Worship Exec Team** are responsible for leading, planning and implementing worship events at CCS. CCS Worship organizes one worship nights per quarter , plans Convocations and provides leadership to the student Worship Team.

With oversight from a faculty advisor, **Club Leaders** provide leadership to a variety of clubs for Rhetoric Students at CCS. We will have a Club Expo at the beginning of the school year to showcase the club opportunities.
