

## CCS On Campus PSAT/NMSQT and PSAT Registration

CCS is offering the **PSAT/NMSQT** and **PSAT** on **Wednesday, October 13**. Students need to arrive by **8:00 a.m.** The test will last until 11:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. depending on administration.

**11<sup>th</sup> graders should take the PSAT/NMSQT.** While this test is a practice SAT (PSAT), it is also the qualifier for the National Merit Scholarship (NMSQT).

**10<sup>th</sup> graders may take the PSAT.** While it is the exact same test that the juniors can take, sophomores take the test for practice. It does not qualify for the National Merit Scholarship. I advise sophomores take it to gain experience and as a baseline.

## FAQ'S

**How much is the test?** The cost of the test is \$25 payable through Veracross Pay.

**What is the deadline to register?** August 26 is the deadline.

**How long will the test last?** For all tests, students must arrive by 8:00 a.m. Anyone arriving after 8:00 a.m., may not be admitted to the exam. Students will be done between 11:45 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. depending on the administration.

**What about cellphones, smart watches, and calculators?** Students may not bring cellphones and smart watches into the test room. They must leave those in the lockers or cars. Students must only use approved calculators.

**When are the results available?** Historically, results for the PSAT/NMSQT are available in December.

**May freshmen take one of these tests?** No, 9<sup>th</sup> graders may not take the PSAT.
