SEMESTER 2 MWF ELECTIVES**

Studio Art	Studio art is the creation of visual art through painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, glass, fiber, or design. Drawing (Introduction)	Learning how to use the 7 basic art elements to add dimension and shape to your line drawings is the key ingredient that will bring your drawings to life. Topics include nutrition, physical exercise, mental health, brief anatomy, spiritual strengthening, and social health, all from a biblical worldview. This class will alternate weekly between classroom and outdoor activities.

Portfolio	A mostly independent study class for students seriously thinking about applying for an art degree or field. The purpose of this class is to give the student the freedom to work on projects that are needed for their portfolio. The instructor will have a progress report for the student to follow for their project. Unless otherwise specified, an application portfolio may include drawings, paintings, photography, digital media, design, three-dimensional work, web design, animation, video and almost any other type of artwork.	
Mens Strength/Weight Training	Train with weights to improve or maintain fitness, strength, and endurance.	Athletic/PE shirt and shorts, purchased from Flynn O'Hara, are required (a CCS spirit wear shirt is also permissible).
History of War	Military History and Philosophy of War - Explore the nature of the history, science, and philosophy of warfare, from the 20th century, covering the world wars up through the Cold War. Throughout the course, we will discuss battles, strategy, tactics, international relations, and philosophical questions such as "When should nations intervene in foreign affairs?" and "Is political freedom worth blood?"	
History of Non-Western Civilizations	Come and learn about the other histories! This elective will cover the histories and cultures of the major civilizations of Asia, Africa, and South America. We will use the collaborative learning approach to make this class engaging and fun. You can look forward to discussions, presentations, food, and skits to reinforce the material.	NEW!
Servant Leaders	If you have a servant heart, this elective is for you! This class is centered around service projects that will bless populations within our local and school communities. Students will participate in the inventing, proposing, planning and execution of service projects throughout the year. This class is sure to strengthen and grow individual leadership, gratitude and appreciation while helping others in the community.	
Strategic Games	This elective is for any student who wants to be challenged and grow in the use of strategy and sometimes teamwork. The class will be centered around several different board and card games that will range from simple to complex, conquest to co-op. All students should be ready to participate, have fun, and stretch your mind.	NEW!

2ND SEMESTER AVAILABLE ELECTIVES

Introduction to Computer Programming (C++)	This program will teach students problem solving skills through C++ programming language. Programming fundamentals include Variables, control statements, loops, arrays, functions, strings, vectors, files, structures and classes. Also, students will be learning prefix, postfix, infix notations; Boolean Algebra; debugging; what does this program do; Recursive functions to strengthen their skills.	
Life Skills	Students learn important skills to help them transition from high school into adulthood. The goal for this course is to equip students to navigate the next phase of life beyond CCS by offering practical information, thought-provoking discussion, and helpful advice. Example topics include basic finance, navigating interpersonal relationships, and basic life skills such as cooking & cleaning, healthy living, time management, and car care. Class format combines interactive discussion and practical application intermixed with occasional guest speakers.
