Frequently Asked Questions

What is Firm Foundation? It is a monthly gathering during the school year for CCS parents who want to dig deeper into the world of classical, Christian education. You will hear CCS guest speakers (e.g., teachers, administrators, coaches, etc.) speak about life in the daily classroom, as well as discuss several integral books which undergird our school's mission.

Who can attend? All CCS parents are encouraged to attend!

When does it meet? We typically meet once a month on a Saturday morning from 8:00 – 9:00 AM.

Where does it meet? We meet at LaFarm Bakery on Cary Parkway in the back meeting room.

Is childcare available? Unfortunately, childcare is not available at this time.

What is the format of the meeting? The goal is to provide a deeper understanding of classical Christian education and how Cary Christian strives to achieve its mission and vision in key areas of the school.
