

CCS Eighth Grade Tea

We are proud of the high standards concerning behavior and dress code at Cary Christian School and believe that we share the responsibility to uphold these standards with our students and our parents. With this in mind, we are asking our parents to partner with us to ensure their student's attire meets the dress code detailed below.

CCS will not hold a formal dress check for this event. However, if your student's attire does not meet the requirements as listed, you may be called to come get your student or to bring your student a different outfit and they may lose their privilege to participate in the next school social event/dance as determined by the CCS Administration.

Dress Code Requirements

- → Please respect the purpose of this event by dressing in the appropriate attire.
- → Tea attire means dress nicely, but not a tuxedo or formal gown.
- → Please keep modesty in mind as you choose your attire.
- + Please keep in mind that our tea is a seated event, and all clothing should not be too tight or too short.

Please wear:	 Slacks with collared button-up shirt with a tie Dress shoes Coat (optional) 	 Dress modestly Dress or Pant suit (dresses with longer skirts work best) Attire should meet the following criteria: Length: should be within 2"-3" of the top of the knee. If a dress has a slit, it should not be more than 2"-3" above the knee. Please remember that a longer dress length is helpful when seated at a table. Straps: must have on-the-shoulder straps (spaghetti straps, one-shoulder or Grecian style, halter, high-neck, are all permitted). Neckline: No deep V or low-cut necklines Back: should be at the natural bra line, no backless dresses
Please do not wear:	Tight-fitting clothing, jeans, or joggersAthletic shoes, crocs, or bootsCostumes or anything less than tea attire.	 Tight form fitting dresses (e.g., bodycon style dresses are not appropriate for this event) Exposed midriff or cutout dresses

NOTE: Please remember that pants and dresses fit differently while standing in your living room than in seated positions. All attire needs to follow these guidelines while actively moving and sitting. Our goal is to be proactive so that there are no questions the afternoon of the event. The best practice is to choose attire through the lens of modesty and to use the standards spelled out above as no one wants to have issues on the afternoon of the tea.
