

Some Specifics about Sixth Grade


- School starts (with a bell) at 8:00am; please drop them off by 7:50




CLASSES FOR SEVENTH GRADE



SPECIALS ARE NOW ELECTIVES


- Elective classes are designed to give each student an array of choices throughout Logic School. There are a few electives that are all-year electives, which will be outlined on the preference sheet.

- Competitions, intramurals and recreational games.


Discipline:







The Standards and Assessments of Our Program

- Team tryouts will begin in May for the next Fall, September for Winter, and October for Spring.
- Preseason practices will begin two months prior to start of official season.
- Attendance will be checked daily and there will be consequences for missing practices or games.
- Except for official school breaks and holidays, teams will practice. Breaks? Teams are expected to practice on teacher workdays.
- Students must be in school by 9:30am in order to practice or play that day. If a student is absent, they
 may not practice or play that day.
- Students will be responsible for school-issued uniforms and or equipment. Lost uniforms or equipment will result in a charge.
- Students will be tested on the first week of official practice to determine fitness.
- Additional assessments may be done during that testing period for speed, explosion, and strength for evaluation purposes.
- We may be looking at skill requirements but will give plenty of notice if those are adopted.
- Students will come prepared to each practice/game and give maximum effort.

The Standards and Assessments of Our Program

- Coaches will provide written evaluations about a student's skills, behavior, and role on the team.
 Beginning and end.
- Coaches will send out a weekly newsletter with schedules (game and practice), locations, information, and highlights. These will be sent out via email or posted in PARENT SQUARE.
- We are working on a "culture of words" that coaches will be responsible for implanting in their programs
- Teams will have a measurable team win goal stated in the preseason to track development.
- Teams will have a measurable team performance metric each year to track development.
- Coaches will have a zoom or in person parent meeting the week before the official season begins.
